

#### Rector's Letter ....

Dear Friends,

As I write this letter, I am sitting in the back garden of The Rectory with the morning sun peeping over next door's roof, blue skies above, noises emanating from distant construction



However, as we all know, such moments are temporary and we have to reenter the real world! Reality often involves problems to be solved, as well telephone calls, or an electronic messages that can change everything. Peace is what we often need but can struggle to find.

In the resurrection appearances of Jesus in John 20, the Lord greeted his followers with the words 'Peace be with you'. Understandably the disciples felt far from at peace at this point. They had received the perplexing news that the Lord had risen from the dead and they were hiding behind locked doors in fear of those who sent their Lord to his cross. However as Bruce Milne in his commentary on John's Gospel stated, Jesus "... stills their inevitable anxiety and confusion with the familiar word of greeting, 'Shalom', 'Peace be with you!" 'Shalom' is a considerably richer notion than a mere absence of stress. In the Old Testament context it basically means well being in the fullest sense. Shalom is '... life at its best under the gracious hand of God. (\*).

Stress inducing situations will come our way. However, the peace giving message of Easter assures us of something deeper and impacting on the realities of life. The risen Jesus gives us reason for hope and incredible assurances to hold on to amidst all that life involves. Through Jesus we experience the grace of God, who is the giver of peace. It is therefore fitting that in Paul's epistles we find greetings that combine these two beautiful words of 'grace' and 'peace'. Easter assures us of the grace of God today and the eternal peace that comes through relationship with him. As his children, we are assured of the gracious presence of God in the Holy Spirit to guide us, enable us and grant us peace.

In anticipation of what was to come, Jesus told his disciples; "'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.'" (Jn 14v27). Mindful of the grace of God, and through trust in him, may we know and receive a growing measure of his peace.



## Curate's Corner....

Dear Friends,

The eggs have been eaten, children are back to school, parents back to work and we may come to the conclusion that Easter is over. Yet we do not live by resurrection power only on one day of the year. We are encouraged to go forward with boldness and the power of the resurrection every single day of our lives.



It is so easy to fall into the mundane routine of life and to forget all of the benefits of what the Lord has done for us. As Christians we have spent the past few weeks in eager anticipation of Easter. We prepared our hearts, we reflected on the cross and its significance, we felt the long, heavy pause between Good Friday and Easter Sunday – waiting for the discovery of an empty grave and a risen Saviour. And then it comes. He comes. And then it's Monday. The temptation is to treat Easter like it is an ending, we have eaten all the chocolate, we've attended services in Church, Jesus has risen, we are no longer abstaining from things like social media, sugary foods and the likes for lent and so we fall into the trap of thinking 'life can go back to normal'.

But nothing was normal after Jesus, in fact nothing was ever the same again. When a man who claims to be God rises from the dead, "business as usual" isn't a thing. When reflecting on Holy Week author Patreeya Thron said "Easter isn't just a time to pause and reflect on some nice truths we tend to forget about the rest of the year. It is the entire crux of our faith. It is the only reason we have to hope."

Easter Sunday is unlike any other Sunday. We come into the Monday as a changed people. Not because we feel shiny and new and different. Not because of what we have accomplished. But because of what was done on our behalf. Because Jesus's resurrection has given us a new identity. Our identity is not in the choices we make or what we accomplish in this life but rather Christ's resurrection.

So let us give Easter the place that it deserves in our lives, not the one day a year but to a moment we celebrate over and over again in the days, weeks and months that follow. As we gather for services from now until Pentecost and as the leader of the service says "Christ is Risen" and we reply with "He is Risen indeed" may we respond with gusto believing that this call to worship is not just for Easter Day but for everyday of the year. Christ has risen! The grave is empty. Everything is changed. How does the resurrection change the way you see your life today?

#### YF3







#### Is God calling you to Reader Ministry?

God has given a variety of gifts to his people, for works of service and ministry. He may have given you the gifts for ministry as a Parish Reader or Diocesan Reader. Perhaps you've felt God prompting you towards a new scope of service in his Church. Could it be that God is calling you to Reader Ministry?

Parish Readers serve by leading God's people in worship: by leading the service, or reading the Bible readings, leading the prayers, or assisting at Holy Communion - in their own parish. Diocesan Readers lead God's people in worship in the same way as Parish Readers, and are also authorised to preach - across the diocese by invitation.

Applications are currently open for the next training courses for both Parish Readers and Diocesan Readers: Parish Reader applications will close on Friday 30th May for selection interviews in June with the course beginning in September. Diocesan Reader applications will close on Friday 29th August for selection interviews in September, with the course starting in January 2026 in the Church of Ireland Theological Institute.


