### Rector's Letter....

Dear Friends,

It always seems to happen every time in and around the summer exam season. The sun begins to shine!!!

As a student at University my exam scores were always better in the winter than the summer. It was like there was an inverse relationship between better weather and lower grades!

For any young people entering June, trying to keep focused and with more exams ahead, despite how it feels, you are nearly there. You have just a few weeks to go! The Flip Chart tells me that by 19th June there will be a collective sense of relief and freedom for you all. A time that you and your families have been eagerly awaiting is just a few weeks away!

On Sunday 8th June we shall celebrate a moment that the followers of Jesus were eagerly awaiting, but perhaps they weren't entirely sure what they were waiting for. In Acts 1v4&5 we read of Jesus "On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: 'Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. For John baptised with water, but in a few days you will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'" As we read Acts 1, it seems that there was a fair degree of confusion amongst the followers of Jesus but then in v8 we read that Jesus told them before his Ascension "... you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.'"

The events of Pentecost (Acts 2) released Jesus' words into reality. Suddenly what Jesus had said, made sense. From Jerusalem, under the power of the Holy Spirit the Church spread and continued to expand, and even today it is growing still.

Just recently a report entitled 'The Quiet Revival' was published by the Bible Society. If you haven't read it, I would encourage you look it up online. The survey behind this report suggests that overall church decline in England and Wales has now reversed and that there are over 2 million more people attending church than there were six years ago. The report also suggests that there has been a particular growth of young men attending church and that that churchgoers are more likely than non-churchgoers to report higher life satisfaction.

It feels like we, the Church, have been waiting for a 'Pentecost moment' for some time. May the Lord's Kingdom Come! May we pray that the effects of a 'Quiet Revival' will be seen in our locality and in our Parish, if not already, soon.

### Curate's Corner....

Dear Friends,

I'm sure if you looked in your purse or wallet right now you would find at least two forms of identification. Perhaps it's a driving licence, a student card or bus pass. And then in the filing cabinet at home or the 'safe place' there are probably passports, birth certificates and the likes. These documents prove who we are and they say something about us; if it's a birth certificate it tells us we are a son/daughter, if it's a driving licence it tells



someone that we can drive, the point being they each tell a story of who we are. As our life circumstances change so does our identity.

When Caroline informs me that Pinnacles week is fast approaching, I usually start asking God what he wants me to write about and usually he gives me just one word, a topic or a theme and this time I feel compelled to write about identity, I'm not sure why but I pray that the Holy Spirit uses these words in some way.

I have recently been wrestling with my identity as a minister and a mum, and how they both work alongside each other. I've been reading a book by Rev Jules Middleton entitled 'Breaking the Mould: Learning to thrive as a ministry Mum' to help shape my thoughts. In the book she provides the following quote:

"Authenticity is the daily practise of letting go who we think we're supposed to be and embracing who we are"

-Brené Brown (2018)

Identity can seem like a buzz word in society at the moment and it is certainly not a topic that we have the time to consider in a Curate's corner. Nonetheless we all have an identity and although our earthly identity changes with our life circumstances (such as getting married, having a baby, achieving a new qualification and more) our identity in Christ never changes, because he is the same yesterday, today and forever. Our identity in Christ isn't just a concept, it's a reality! It means our purpose in life can be found in Christ Jesus. Our identity is rooted in his unchanging love and promises, not in the fleeting opinions of others or in worldly achievements.

Knowing our identity is in Christ is one thing, but understanding how that practically changes the way we live is another. Here are a few ways that understanding our true identity in Christ can greatly impact the way we live:

We no longer chase after the desires of our flesh but instead seek to glorify God in all areas of life.

1 John 2:15-17

If we do not seek to find identity in Jesus alone then we are seeking it elsewhere. But when we find our identity is in the eternal things of Christ, we won't get lost seeking the attractive but empty things the world offers because Christ gives us a stable and eternal hope in a world of unstable hopelessness.

### We no longer fear the future.

Romans 8:14-15

If we have peace with God, then we have nothing to fear on this earth. Our eternities are secure as adopted daughters and sons of Christ. So, we don't need to fear financial collapse, losing our job, or being ridiculed for our faith. Of course, these things aren't easy or painless, but we can have confidence that our heavenly Father is sovereign over every moment of our lives and will equip us for every single thing He ordains.

# 3.We have no need to judge or compare ourselves to others when we seek to please Christ alone.

Romans 14:5-8

Judging the decisions that others make can suck the life right out of us and create insecurity due to our desire to please people over God. We can ask Christ for wisdom in this area, be open to hear and discern other people's perspectives without judgment, and walk in confidence that God is the only one we need to honour and please in these decisions.

We often also compare ourselves to the gifts and blessings of others. We are all created with the purpose of glorifying God in the unique ways He has created us. One person is filled with creativity while another glorifies God with a beautiful voice.

We must seek to glorify Christ in our gifts and not get lost in the joy-sucking pursuit of trying to be something God never created us to be. Don't miss out on the blessing of serving Christ where you are with what He has chosen for you.

Understanding our identity Christ will bring us freedom and joy. It will allow us to live authentic lives without fear or comparison of others. If you are wrestling with questions of identity then turn to the word of od, seek his truth about who you are in Christ. Embrace the reality that are chosen, called to glorify God and deeply loved.
