


# PINNACLES DECEMBER/JANUARY

Dear Friends,

## Curate's Corner....

Dear Friends,

How good are you at waiting? Are you a patient person? As a child, one of the things I loved most at this time of year was when my Granny bought me an Advent Calendar. There was something exciting about opening a small cardboard door and eating the chocolate before heading out the door to school. The only thing better than that chocolate each day was when, by some miracle, I'd missed the day before and I got a double portion! In the spirit of honesty, I have to admit that there was



one particular day when things hadn't gone so well at school, I came home made a cup of tea and couldn't wait any longer - so I opened the rest of the advent calendar!

Advent means waiting, but for many it's simply the run up to the big day - Christmas. We live in an instant society where we want things and we want them right away; instant coffee, same day delivery, 30 minute wash cycles and so much more all point to the fact that we're not very good at waiting. But the Jewish community knew all to well what it meant to wait, they had been waiting for the Messiah for centuries. They had lost everything in previous years and once again they found themselves under foreign rule. Isaiah's words would have been a renewed comfort for their longing for a King:

"The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned." You have enlarged the nation and increased their joy; they rejoice before you as people rejoice at the harvest... For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting-Father, Prince of Peace. Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end"

Isaiah 9:2-3a, 9:6-7a

You can imagine that they took great comfort in Isaiah's assurance that their captivity would not last forever and their new King would be everything they dreamed of and more. I don't know about you but I tend to think of Jesus in Advent as a baby, far from the strong and powerful image that Isaiah paints. But Isaiah's words remind us of just what Jesus gave up to be Mary's son. He traded the throne of heaven for a smelly manger and scratchy straw. Jesus was not just going to be someone who could say 'I know how you feel'. Isaiah's words tell us that we can cry out to our Saviour, not just because he understands our weaknesses, but because he can conquer them with his strength and power.

Advent proves the point that God's people are a waiting people. From Abraham and Sarai waiting for a child to Joseph waiting in his prison cell to be remembered by those he sought to help. Times of waiting like Advent are a reminder that God works in our waiting, they are not wasted times, but refining and hope-filled.


Our first programme last year was very positively evaluated by participants, who continue to meet regularly to avail of each others friendship and support, therefore we very much look forward to running another programme.




#### **CHI-ME & PILATES**




