### Rector's Letter .....

Dear Friends,

So are you used to referring to 'The King' instead of 'The Queen' yet? Being honest when singing the National Anthem or leading parts of our prayer book services with references to the late Queen, I have to really focus!



Such was the length of the late Queen's reign, most of us will not remember her Coronation on 2nd June 1953. The King's Coronation Service on Saturday 6th May 2023, will therefore be an event, if at all possible, not to miss.

It is estimated that Queen Elizabeth II's Coronation was viewed by more than 20 million people on their black and white television sets. It was a vast audience, although then was a time when many homes didn't have televisions. Today is a very different reality. With many homes having several televisions and the availability to view on electronic devices, like never before will people from all over the world be see, hear and in some way be part of the Coronation of a Sovereign.

The ceremony will be rich with symbolism and historical custom. Whilst the detail of the service has not yet been released, it will be an enriching experience for us all. As explained on the Royal Family's Website; "The coronation ceremony is an occasion for pageantry and celebration, but it is also a solemn religious ceremony and has remained essentially the same over a thousand years. For the last 900 years, the ceremony has taken place at Westminster Abbey, London. The service is conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury, whose task this has almost always been since the Norman Conquest in 1066."

The Coronation of the King, as with those who have preceded him, will be set within a service of Christian Worship that recognises that even earthly Kings should bow to the King of Kings. As we approach the Coronation of The King, let us read and ponder upon the 'Christ Hymn' of Philippians 2 which speaks of the Son of God, undertaking the greatest possible act of humility, and was raised to unimaginable eternal glory, and to whom all will bow. His is a reign that will never end. His is a Kingdom that each of us can be a part of for always.

May God save the King. May we all rejoice in and worship the risen, ascended and glorified King of Kings.

Curate's Corner....

Dear Friends...

From Easter Sunday until Pentecost at the beginning of services we usually say a greeting along the lines of "Christ is Risen" and the congregation respond "The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia". It is meant to be said with gusto and enthusiasm for the tomb is empty!

You may have experienced that Easter joy again this year, where the truth of the resurrection felt fresh and real. Perhaps

you sensed the immediacy of it, like the women at the tomb when they were told that Jesus was not there because He had risen from the dead. However somehow Easter, even more than Christmas, tends to fade from consciousness after the big day. Ask yourself are you feeling joyful? Many of us are aware throughout the 40 days of Lent of the penitential spirit of the season and the acts of self-denial or sacrifice that we've undertaken. However, are we equally conscious of the 50 days of Easter and the call to joy? Are we even clear that joy like self-denial during Lent is something we must pursue?

We don't just look forward to feeling joyful on resurrection Sunday. That joy we felt should not be fleeting. Rather we should be continuing to rejoice. Yes we live in a broken and anxious world. Two years ago Easter plans were disrupted by the pandemic. Perhaps for us, this Easter has been overshadowed by Russia's invasion of Ukraine, not to mention economic worries including inflation and the cost of living. And let's not forget violence and war in other countries such as Yemen, Sudan and Afghanistan. Then there are the individual crosses that we all carry such as financial worries, marital problems, difficult relationships with parents or children, health problems and more. We live every day in the shadow of Good Friday, but it is also possible to live in the light of Easter.

Easter is not just one day or even just an eight-week season. Easter is our identity, it is who we are as disciples. Pope John Paul II correctly once said "We are an Easter people and Alleluia is our song!"

Despite everything that is going on in our lives, how do we continue to pursue Joy not only in this Easter season but throughout the year? Our joys as well as our sorrows in life matter to God. When bad things happen, we often tell ourselves and one another that God has a plan, that God works for good in all things, and he does. However, at the same time let us never forget that there is great meaning in joy too. Every good gift in this world speaks to us of God's goodness and love.

Let us ask God for the gift of joy. Many of us perhaps asked God for help during Lent as we made sacrifices, so why should we not ask him to fill us with Easter joy?" The source of our joy is faith. If you want joy, nourish your faith, feed your spiritual hunger. Give yourself permission to do things that give you joy.

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! (Philippians 4:4)

Christ has died, Christ has risen, Christ will come again! Alleluia!

#### Worship

### HOLY COMMUNION UPDATE

Arising from the reopening of churches amidst the Covid pandemic, temporary provision was offered by the House of Bishops for the use of individual cups for Holy Communion services. Last spring, it was deemed to be safe to return to using the common cup,



therefore the option of the sharing of the chalice was reintroduced, whilst permission to use individual cups remained. Since then, in St Mark's we have been offering communicants with the choice of the common chalice, or individual disposable plastic communion cups.

It was always the intention of the House of Bishops that one day, all parishes would return to the usage of the chalice exclusively. To that end, correspondence has recently been circulated to clergy stating that individual cups should not be used following Pentecost Sunday (June 4th).

At present we have enough little cups to be able to continue offering them until some point between Easter and Pentecost. Therefore it is my intention to offer the chalice only when our current stock of individual cups runs out. If communicants would feel more comfortable by receiving the bread only, that is perfectly acceptable. The Bishops' Communication stated that "... Those who remain for their own reasons nervous about receiving from the common cup should be respected, and they should receive in one kind only, with an assurance that the Church teaches that the sacrament can be fully received in one kind."

I hope that parishioners feel reassured concerning this matter. Should you have any queries or concerns, please feel free to contact Sarah or myself.


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
