Rector's Letter....

Dear Friends,

On Friday 17th October, I had the great pleasure of visiting Mr George Lutton on his 100th Birthday. Being able to represent his church

family in wishing George a Happy Birthday, and to be able to personally celebrate it with him and his family was an immense privilege. Truly, his birthday was an occasion of sincere joy and we wish George every blessing for the future! George is a man who has attended worship throughout his lifetime and on many, many occasions he has declared a statement of faith that shares a significant milestone with his centenary year. 2025 marks the 17th centenary of the Nicene Creed. The original version of the Nicene Creed originated from the Council of Nicea of 325AD. At a time when the early Church was developing its theological understanding and seeking to respond to controversial views being shared, the Council of Nicea met, and as part of its outcomes, a statement of doctrine was issued, which was later amended at the Council of Constantinople in 381, and has been an articulation of our Christian faith ever since. Like other features of our Prayer Book Services, The Nicene Creed, which we profess together during services of Holy

Communion has immensely deep roots.

One of the beautiful realities of services of worship in a church is that it is one of the few places where, like an earthly family gathering together, it is an intergenerational community in one place at one time. For each generation there will be differing norms of daily life, however when we gather for worship together, perhaps representing three or four generations of people, we join together and declare our common faith, as one, in words like the Nicene Creed or the Apostles' Creed. Using such ancient words we proclaim a faith that is personal and corporate, and has been professed over many generations before, and will continue to be so until the Lord's return.

In our worship, we declare our common trust in and love of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As we do so, let us be profoundly aware that surrounding us are our church family, saying the same words of belief, of all generations, together as one.

Curate's Corner...

Dear Friends,

You may have seen recently on TV or social media that Lidl and Aldi launched their wooden toy collection approximately two weeks ago. Shoppers across the UK queued outside stores to get their hands on a bargain. As I entered Lidl to do the weekly groceries on Monday evening, I wondered why the middle aisle shelves were empty, one worker informed me that they sold out of their wooden toys in less than an hour. I have to say I do love a Lidl middle aisle find but I



don't think you'd see me queuing at the crack of dawn. Lidl and Aldi may have sold out of wooden toys but they always seem to have an oversupply of pressure cookers and it got me thinking about the subject of pressure in our lives. Perhaps you already have a pressure cooker and don't need another one or maybe your life already feels like a pressure cooker boiling over at the moment. Consciously or unconsciously, the average person today faces a myriad of different pressures. For some it may even feel like life is one big pressure cooker.

Pressure is something we all face, but we don't have to let it crush us. God has given us the Holy Spirit to help us when we feel pressure. He can guide us, give us wisdom and develop us.

Pressure is another word that we use for stress. Pressure squeezes out what's inside—like lumps of coal thrive under pressure to become precious diamonds and olives release their oil when they are crushed. This applies to our earthly lives as well, we need some pressure (not too much!) to keep us going in life, to reach our potential, and to stop us from becoming stale.

Let's consider Paul's words in Philippians 4:6: "Don't worry about anything, but pray about everything. With thankful hearts offer up your prayers and requests to God". Another scripture translation says *in every circumstance continue to make your wants known to God*. God wants us to bring every pressure or stress in our lives to him in prayer. The more we release to him, the more inner peace we shall experience. The loving God who holds the universe together cares for us, and he alone has the power and love to guide our lives and bring us into peace. All of us have to deal with pressure. Sometimes it comes from the unavoidable stuff of everyday life. So, the only safe and thing to do is to surrender your problems to the One who gave his Life for us. Surrendering isn't another thing to add to the to do list, it's a letting go, a relief and assurance that our times are in God's hands.

Paul said in 2 Corinthians 4:8: "We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed." Talk about pressure, I think Paul experienced the most. Yet whether the pressure was minor or major, he persevered on, not giving into the pressure. It's only possible through belief in a God that is all powerful. So whatever pressures you are facing in life take them to the feet of Jesus and feel the weight fall off your shoulders and a peace beyond understand resonate through your body, mind and soul.

PARISH NURSE UPDATE

The Parish Nursing service in St Mark's is now into its fourth year, and with a good mix of activities that include pastoral visiting, support to parishioners requiring guidance around their health and social care, the annual bereavement journey programme and the weekly Cafe Hope. I continue to be grateful to the Select Vestry and to our Health and Faith Leadership Team for their guidance and support. Given the timely support of a grant from the Church of Ireland Priorities Fund, several of us have been undertaking accredited training in loss and grief, to ensure we have a growing and equipped pool of facilitators to lead on the bereavement journey programme. In addition to this we are moving into the area of substance misuse support and undertaking training in the area of recovery coaching to help local people deal with the challenges they experience in the area of addiction. We are also keen to develop the role of volunteers and Parish Nursing assistants, for which a national training programme will take place over four days in November. 

WITH HEART & SOUL & VOICE

Scriptural Songs (also called Canticles) are a regular features of Anglican Services of Worship. Two Scriptural Songs that we regularly sing or say in St Mark's (The Magnificat and The Benedictus) originate in Luke's Gospel before the birth of Jesus and another two Scriptural Songs, which also feature in our services (The Gloria in Excelsis and The Nunc Dimittus), are recorded by Luke after Christ's birth.

This year, Tim Chester has produced an Advent Devotional Book based on these four Scriptural Songs entitled 'With Heart & Soul & Voice'. For each day of Advent, which begins this year on Sunday 30th November, there is a short reflection based upon just a few verses from The Magnificat, The Benedictus, The Gloria and The Nunc Dimittus. We will gladly order copy


