Rector's Letter

Dear Friends,

As I write this letter, I do so following our Ash Wednesday Service in St Mark's. Beginning our series from the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) we considered the Beatitudes and what they might mean for us today. One particular Beatitude was es-



pecially thought provoking for me personally. "¹⁰ Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." For those affected by persecution due to being a follower of Jesus, this Beatitude is surely comforting. It is hard for us to imagine being persecuted for our faith, but the Open Doors Website claims that over 360 million Christians suffer persecution and discrimination. Those who suffer for their faith need to be prayed for and supported. As Christians we are to be mindful of the experiences and needs of our brothers and sisters in the Lord.

Whilst reflecting upon this Beatitude I was challenged by an argument that suggests that it is unfortunate that many more churches are not, in some way, opposed or persecuted. Why would this be we might ask? Surely, peace and harmony are to be thankful for! The suggestion is that churches that aren't opposed or persecuted can be so because they are simply blending in amongst the community that they are part of. Instead of standing out amidst a society that isn't focused upon God, they are saying the same things, offering little by the way of 'salt' and 'light' which Jesus encouraged his listeners to be in the verses following the Beatitudes.

The thought of standing out as a follower of Jesus can frighten us. That we might be ridiculed, opposed and even persecuted for our faith and its claims is discomforting. It is important that we listen to the views of others. However, if we are faithful to the teachings of Scriptures and the Christian tradition that we have received, we will be odds with some opinions and values that we encounter in our society, community and even within the Church. We shouldn't fear opposition. Instead, inspired by Jesus, we should graciously seek to offer distinctive lives that seek to honour the Lord who offered the truth despite resistance.

May opposition because of our faith not cause us to fear. Salt and Light are what we are encouraged to be. Graciously, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, may we shine as a people of faith in Jesus and may what we say and do inspire thought and encourage those around us to consider becoming and being known as a follower of Christ too.

Curate's Corner....

Dear Friends,

Are you listening? One thing that really used to annoy me when I was younger was having to repeat stuff time and time again because adults weren't listening properly to me. In my undergraduate degree as part of our pastoral care course, we had classes on how to actively listen to



someone. Listening is something many of us struggle with, and in fact as our pre-marriage course gets underway this month we'll be looking at how listening is two way. We must talk with one another but we must also carefully listen to each other.

So as humans living in a chaotic and ever changing world, it's no wonder we find it difficult to listen. But what about listening to God? How often do we listen to our creator? Do we know what his voice sounds like?

In homegroup over the past few months we've been discussing big questions of faith. As I write this, I'm preparing for our time together this week which will be focused on how to hear God. As I was preparing I was promoted to reflect on how long I spend listening to God. So often I come to God in prayer with a shopping list of what I want to see happen, what I want him to do and after I say 'Amen', I go about my day to day. But in that I've forgot to listen, I'm so busy with and preoccupied with what's happening next that I haven't taken the time to hear God. Perhaps many of you do the same? God calls us to listen, listen in scripture for his voice, listen to him speaking through others, listen to him leading us through the spirit.

When I get a phone call from my parents or from Daniel (my husband), from the very first syllable that they speak I know who it is because I know their voice. As Christians we should strive to know Gods voice so deeply that we recognise it as soon as we hear it.

This lent, I encourage you to be intentional about listening to God, listen for prompting, directing and leading you. If you're interested to know more about hearing God please get in touch, we can go for a coffee or else come along to homegroup as we go deeper with questions such as this.





HOMEGROUP

The idea of a homegroup is not a new one. In fact this is how the early church originally met. The word *church* is a translation from the Greek word *ekklesia*, it was the common word for a meeting or gathering of people. So, in the New Testament, a church was a gathering of Christians and did not mean a particular type of building or a denomination. Homegroup is therefore a wider expression of church. God never intended for us to live the Christian life alone.

As homegroup we meet every 3 weeks in someone's house for fellowship together and learning. At the moment we are discussing big faith questions, for example we've be looking at where is God in suffering, why does he allow it? and once you give your life to Christ are you always a Christian? The topics may seem deep but we take time to listen to scripture, one another and learn more about living out our faith.

Homegroup is always open for others to come along see what it's all about. If you need any further information please get in contact with Sarah.


