Dear Friends,

This month we very much look forward to commemorating the Platinum Jubilee of the reign of Her Majesty The Queen. For 70 years, The Queen has been an exceptionally faithful Monarch of our nation and Commonwealth. What an example she is to us all!

Curate's Corner...

Dear Friends

Every story whether fictional or non-fictional has a beginning, a middle and an end. Regardless of genre or author these three parts are what makes up a story.

Perhaps you have a favourite story. I've shared before that my favourite story as a child was a book by Sam McBratney called 'Guess how much I love you'. It is a story of two hares; Nutbrown and little nutbrown and the book uses a larger measure on each page to signify how much they love each other. For example, "I love you as high as I can hop". I'm not sure why it was my favourite as a child, whether it was the pictures or the actual story, but regardless it also had a beginning, a middle and an end.

As we prepare to celebrate her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee there have been documentaries on TV, news articles and books published on her life. They've all been about the mark that she has made, her faith and the legacy that she will leave. This got me thinking about my legacy, my story, what will people say?

Recently one Sunday morning I shared the story of Saul (Paul) who like every one of us had a story. As I prepared for the sermon, I began to look at Paul's beginning, his middle and his end and it got me thinking about my life story and what people will remember about my beginning, middle and end. For a few moments I want us to reflect on those three sections of beginning, middle and end.

The Beginning

Our story ultimately begins with our creator. No matter how old you are, our story must begin with the grace shown by Jesus on the cross. Paul tells us about this beginning to our story in 2Corinthians 5V17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come the old has gone, the new is here"

The Middle

Just like every story has a beginning, every story has a middle. For the child of God, and even looking at Paul's life and ministry, the middle is, and was so important.

So how do we ensure that we have a good middle of our story? The Psalmist said it best in *Psalm 119:9-16:*

By carefully reading the map of your Word. I'm single-minded in pursuit of you; don't let me miss the road signs you've posted. I've banked your promises in the vault of my heart so I won't sin myself bankrupt. Be blessed, God; train me in your ways of wise living. I'll transfer to my lips all the counsel that comes from your mouth; I delight far more in what you tell me about living than in gathering a pile of riches. I ponder every morsel of wisdom from you, I attentively watch how you've done it. I relish everything you've told me of life, I won't forget a word of it.

In order to have a middle of our story that honours the God that gave us a beginning, we need to heed the words that were given to a young man in this Psalm. By guarding our hearts according to God's word, not wandering from his commandments and storing up his word and promises in our hearts.

The End

When I think about the end of my life here on earth, I don't think about my physical body, I think about that moment when I will stand before God, my creator. It will be a time for reward, or a time for rebuke. That to me will be the end of my story, at least here on earth.

In Matthew 25:14-21 Jesus tells a parable that gives us a glimpse of that ending time for each one of us. In this passage when the first man was faithful to what the Master has asked, he was given a reward. You see his beginning and middle determined his ending. The words of his master "Well down you good and faithful servant"

This is the ending I want to hear as the conclusion to my story. What about you? I'm sure the answer is yes, but again let me say this, the ending to your story will be determined by your beginning and your middle. What story do you want to be told of your life?


