Rector's Letter

Dear Friends,
Doesn't it always seems that good weather
arrives when young people are undertaking
exams?! As I write this letter it is a
beautiful day in May and the Exam Prayer Flip
Chart is filled with names of young people to



be remembered in prayer as they seek to remain focused and achieve the best that they can in their examinations.

I will never forget finishing my last exam in Queen's University Belfast rejoicing in the knowledge that I would never have to revise and sit exams again. It was a wonderful feeling and what I thought was the beginning of a career soon followed. However, four years later I found myself sitting in the exam hall of Trinity College Dublin at the end of the first year of my Theology Degree in preparation for ordained ministry. A lesson was truly learned - 'never say never'!!

Exams can be a very stressful time as young people seek to achieve the best that they can in order to progress to the next stage of their education, or towards the beginning of a career. May each person whom we know undertaking exams be enabled to prepare well, recall their learning effectively, apply it correctly, and at all stages of the process be at ease.

We believe in a Lord in whom we can trust to guide us and help us at every moment of our lives, exams or otherwise. The message of Pentecost is that, as Jesus promised, the Holy Spirit ministers to and through all who trust in Jesus as Lord. Jesus promised his disciples on a number of occasions that they would not be alone. A famous example of this is found in the last words of Matthew's Gospel; "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." We might not think of him very much, but as followers of Jesus, we can be assured that the Holy Spirit is with us always.

As people of faith in Jesus, let us ask for a greater awareness of the Holy Spirit's presence in our lives. May he shape us, guide us, reassure us, help us to be aware of the love of Jesus and respond to his love by loving him and becoming more like him.

Curate's Corner....

Dear Friends,

What really bugs you? What does it take for steam to come out of your ears? Perhaps it's the sound of chalk scraping along a blackboard, someone cutting the cheese diagonally instead of straight or someone not replacing the toilet roll once it is done. We all have frustrations whether they are big or small and they can really get to us.



Frustration can be defined as "the feeling of being upset / annoyed as a result of being unable to change or achieve something". We have all lived through some 'testing times' and it may have left us feeling more frustration than we'd like to admit. Frustration is a natural response to what is happening in our lives and in the world around us, indeed the Bible is full of people who were frustrated. Jonah was very frustrated when God asked him to go to Nineveh to preach His word. He didn't think the people of Nineveh deserved God's gracious compassion, so he ran away. Have you ever felt frustrated with God and turned in the opposite direction of his leading? Sarah becomes frustrated by what she perceives as an unkept promise from God and encouraged Abraham to sleep with her servant to produce an heir. When we are waiting for something important, it's frustrating and discouraging to be told to wait some more. When we take the situation into our own hands and rely on our own strength, things can go strangely wrong. More disappointment and frustration can follow.

There are a few times where even Jesus seemed to feel frustrated. His disciples lacked faith in Him. They had seen him perform many miracles, and He taught them daily. But they still lacked faith and understanding.

"You of little faith!... Do you not understand?... How is it you don't understand?"
-Matthew 16:8-12

It must have been frustrating for Jesus to realise that people were not learning from his teaching, yet he never lost a spirit of love for his disciples. I wonder do we express the same spirit of love to others even in the midst of deep frustration?

Along with everyday and situational frustrations, have you ever felt frustrated with God? Have you ever asked God "why"?

What about when you feel your prayers have been unanswered or answered but not in the way you planned? I'm sure there have been times we've all felt frustrated with God. It's an emotional response that we sometimes direct towards Him.

We read that David cried out many times in the Psalms- "How long, O Lord, how long?" or "when?", or "why?

Even in the middle of David's deep frustration there is a rich lesson. David took his frustration straight to God and wrestled with Him over his situations. God knows our hearts and minds; He knows when we feel frustrated. He understands all our emotions. When we approach Him with a spirit of seeking understanding, clarity, and comfort, He will bring it to us. But it is wrong for us to question God because we think He made a mistake, or He isn't keeping His promises. Come to Him with a heart that earnestly seeks to understand. There may be times when He says "Just trust Me."

Frustration is a reaction and it is a natural response We live in a fallen and frustrating world, however we *are to live and wait in hope, not frustration*. Eventually, our frustration (and the world's) will end. We look forward to an eternal life with Christ.

In the meantime, take one day at a time, immerse yourself in scripture trusting God's plan and will for you as his beloved. Persevere in trials Look forward to all that God has planned for us. When trials come, remember God is in complete control. Hang on to the lifeline of prayer.



PARISH NURSE UPDATE

Approaching a year of parish nursing in St Mark's I have been thinking that it would be helpful to provide parishioners with a short progress overview of the service that is currently in place. Wednesday is the main day of the week for meeting people and it has been encouraging to have had an opportunity to meet with a good number of people during this first year, whether in their own home, in the Church Office, on the telephone, or at a venue of their choice. Parish nursing is a health and wellbeing ministry which aims to support our clergy in St Mark's with pastoral care, such as undertaking hospital and care home visiting, meeting directly with people who have health and illness concerns, signposting and supporting individuals to navigate and engage with health and care services.

We have also facilitated two lunchtime open meetings in the Crozier Hall, each consisting of something to eat and a talk from an invited speaker. The most recent lunch took place in February and included a healthy nutrition talk, focused on the needs of older people during winter. A further seniors lunch is being planned for Wednesday 28th June, with further information and a sign-up sheet to follow in the coming weeks. The theme this time will be around mobility and exercise, and a speaker from Age NI has agreed to take part. During the coming months it is hoped to develop topical talks on a range of subjects for people of all ages across our Parish.

Between January and March this year we ran the Bereavement Journey programme for the first time in St Mark's, this first occasion involving an inspiring group of fourteen people, each of whom have experienced personal loss as a result of bereavement and have been working through their grieving process. Evaluation from participants was very positive and the group has continued to meet in an informal yet supportive way and have been helping me explore ideas for future support initiatives. Two of these which we intend to progress in the coming months are to host a 'Cafe', for people who have experienced any type of loss, not just through bereavement, and with the aim of helping people deal with the emotional impact of loss. We also plan to commence in June, a 'Wednesday Wellbeing Walk' in Armagh, for parishioners of all ages and interests. We will also look forward to running the Bereavement Journey programme again next year.

I continue to be very grateful to the group of people from St Mark's who helped me develop the Parish Nursing service from it's starting point last September. We will have a further meeting on 31st May, during which we plan to think about the future direction of the service and to develop a plan for the year ahead. This will include an objective to successfully apply for funding to, among other things, appoint a Parish Nurse, which would enable us to expand beyond the current one day per week voluntary service. It has been pleasing that during our first year, we have received three small grants, from the Church of Ireland Mind Matters seed funding grant scheme, also from Ark / Triangle Housing - both of these to help us establish the Bereavement Journey programme; and finally a King's Coronation Grant from ABC Council, which will enable us to launch the Loss Cafe with a BBQ later this summer.

During the coming months, it is hoped that we will develop a team of volunteers to support the service and I also look forward to completing the training programme as formal preparation for becoming a Parish Nurse and then achieving the accreditation of our service. We will continue to engage with the local Trust and with GPs in the Armagh area, all of whom we met last autumn to explain the role and functions of a Parish Nurse, and how the role complements rather than duplicates health and care for local people. Our links with the only other Parish Nursing service in Northern Ireland are strong, meeting quarterly with colleagues from Portstewart to share ideas for service development, and also via the UK Parish Nursing Ministries online portal, there is access to a wide range of training and support nationally.

Thank you for your continued support and prayers for the service, and please be in touch via the contact details provided, should you wish to discuss support or indeed have any ideas for how we might further develop Parish Nursing in St Mark's.
