Dear Friends,

A television programme that we have very much enjoyed in recent weeks is 'Race across the World'. I wonder if you have seen it? If you haven't, there are several series available on BBC iPlayer. I would definitely recommend it!

What I really enjoy about this programme is the sense of adventure that it involves. Paired contestants from the UK are dropped off in a part of the world that they probably have never been to before. They are given a sum of money which would equate to the cost of a flight to the end destination. However, in the race, the contestants are not allowed to fly. They can only travel overland, via a number of check points, in a race to the ultimate destination. I don't want to spoil the programme for you, therefore I shall say no more!

The contestants race positions offer only part of the interest that this programme brings. The series also records the personal stories of each person involved and what it is that they learn about themselves, and the person that they are racing with, amidst what is a considerably challenging experience.

Having just recently commemorating Pentecost, I am mindful of the journey that we take with the disciples of Jesus as we read through the Gospels and into Acts. As readers we meet the prominent disciples in their calling to follow Jesus. We read of the miracles that they observed, as well as the teaching experiences that Jesus afforded to them. We learn of their successes and failures. We observe their absolutely devastating experience of the Lord's crucifixion, but rejoice with them in the immense wonder of his resurrection. As we conclude the Gospels and open the book of Acts, we share in their waiting on either side of Jesus' ascension and then marvel at the incredible release of the mission of the Church at Pentecost. Something akin to 'Race across the world', the Apostles are set on a mission which has been the feature of the Church ever since as it seeks to share the Gospel message to cultures all over the world. We are part of this continuing mission. Whilst we are not in competition with each other, as followers of Jesus, together we are in the race that will finish on the day of his return.

In the time that we have to take part, let us run our part of the race of faith with dedication and anticipation. Let us pray and be involved. In the words of Paul "... let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith." (Hebrews 12). As you will read in this and subsequent issues of Pinnacles, initiatives to help us grow in our faith are available to us this summer and beyond. Opportunities to serve are also available to us all year through. Let us not spectate, may we be involved!

Worship

Our Parish Youth Club meets fortnightly on Fridays (7.30pm) in The Crozier Hall. Intended for young people of School Year 6 and above, we have a range of regular and special activities and trips.

YF3

Youth Fellowship meets on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month from 5pm - 6.30pm. It is intended for young people of secondary school age and as well as learning from the Bible, we enjoy crazy games and some time just to chat together.

Home Group

This is an informal gathering of people who meet in a house every three weeks on Tuesday evenings (7.30pm) to think about a Biblical passage and talk about it together. Sweet treats and a time to chat also feature!

Bible Fellowship

Bible Fellowship will take place in the context of our mid week services on Wednesdays at 7.30pm in the Church. We have group discussion and everyone is always welcome to join us.

Curate's Corner....

Dear Friends,

I was reminded this week that babies born during the pandemic will be starting school this September. You can imagine the shock on my face! In many ways lockdown feels like not so long ago but in another frame of mind it feels like a distant memory from another lifetime. I was driving to visit my parents in Lisburn last weekend when I passed a local shop where we used to get our groceries,



Daniel exclaimed "Remember having to queue outside that shop just to get milk". Nowadays If there's a queue at the checkout we immediately get disgruntled, we don't like having to wait for something. We live in a culture where we want something and we want it now. Perhaps our tolerance for waiting and lessons learned during the pandemic have left. Perhaps you're waiting for something? The long awaited summer holiday? Exam results? A family wedding? A response from that dream job you applied for? We are all counting down to something and waiting either patiently or impatiently for it to come to pass. We all have times when we feel the ache, the longing, the discomfort, of waiting. Waiting tests not just our faith but our thinning patience.

A long season of waiting can indeed be painful and isolating, but it seems these seasons are simply a part of life, we cannot avoid them.

For a moment ponder the hours upon hours we spend waiting each week. Maybe, it's for the little things: waiting on the traffic light to turn green, the next episode to become available, the tea to brew, the queue to move faster. Sometimes, the waiting is unbearable and bewildering, like when you're waiting for God to heal someone you love.

Perhaps you want to push through the hard times, be strong, but instead, you find yourself paralysed in a waiting room miles from where you want to be. Waiting can feel like a weakness, especially in a culture that places a high value on making things happen and making them happen now. But waiting is not a weakness. It's actually empowering. There is something miraculous happening while we wait.

Psalm 27:14 says:

"Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord"

In The Message the same verse is paraphrased as:

"I'm sure now I'll see God's goodness in the exuberant earth. Stay with God! Take heart. Don't quit. I'll say it again: Stay with God."

God is strengthening our hearts while we wait!

Waiting when we have little control can feel vulnerable and dangerous. Yet sometimes, when we least expect it, we realise God might be doing something good in the middle of the wait. If you are feeling weary from waiting, remember that God may have you right where you need to be for reasons you can't quite yet see.

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1ST TUESDAY HOLY COMMUNION SERVICES


A Holy Communion Service will take place in St Mark's on Tuesday 4th June at 11.30am.


