Rector's Letter....

Dear Friends,

As we approach this year's Remembrance Sunday, we are reminded by our news headlines that our world continues to be a very troubled place. The Israel and Hamas war, as well as the Ukraine and Russia



war, are most prominently on our television news programmes, our app headlines and in our newspapers. However, as these well reported wars continue, perhaps beyond the scope of our awareness are conflicts in places like Somalia, Sudan, Myanmar, Syria and Yemen.

The causes of wars are often complex and usually require some detailed historical study to gain any sense of why they happen. Whilst sadly sometimes armed conflict is necessary, irrespective of its motivation, war is a tragedy of the greatest proportions. History records the horrendous outcomes of war. The advancement of academic research has shown us that for combatants and civilians the psychological scars of war run very deep. Even when weapons are no longer required, and peace is declared, the implications of conflict ripples on in the consciousness of those affected and help is required, even for generations to come.

Jesus grew up and lived in a land that wasn't a peaceful place. His was a land under the rule of the Roman Empire and there was the possibility that many hoped Jesus would lead a political rebellion. However, Jesus' purpose was greater; "I have come into the world as light, so that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness." (John 12v46). Jesus is the giver of everlasting freedom and in the fullness of His Kingdom, peace will be ultimately prevail. Until that time, we are to be messengers of peace that is found in him, but also encouragers of peace with one another. In the Beatitudes, Jesus taught; "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God." Matthew 5v9).

Mindful of the tragedy of war, let us pray for people of influence and that they may be peace encouragers and facilitators. Let us pray that fighting can cease and that opportunities for nations to live alongside one another can be found. May motivations for war be overcome with a will for peace. Let us also remember to pray for all who suffer because of the lasting impacts of war. May the victims of war be assisted and enabled to flourish again.
