Rector's Letter.....



Dear Friends,

Without taking to time to consider, think of three people or things that you can immediately say 'thank you' to God for.

Were you surprised by your thoughts? Thinking more about it, would you revise your list?

We are amidst and entering a season when we especially consider reasons for which we should be thankful.

On the fourth Sunday in Lent, we traditionally give thanks for our mothers or those who have been like mothers to us. It is fitting that we remember and celebrate those who bless us with motherly love. Their's is a self sacrifice that is be responded to with thankfulness. Praise God for such special people who are or have been such a blessing to us.

The season of Lent is a special time when we remember how Jesus spent 40 days and nights in the wilderness, fasting and alone. Despite his weakness he possessed the strength required to resist temptation, as enticing as it was. For this we can be immensely thankful. In the wilderness Jesus has shown that he was the worthy person to be the sinless Saviour, one who would die not for his sins, but yours and mine.

In the approach to and during Holy Week there are many incredibly precious teachings of Jesus that give us immense hope and reason to be thankful. On the Thursday of Holy Week (Maundy Thursday), Jesus gave his followers a method of remembering what would happen during the following days with thankful hearts. As you will see in the Book of Common Prayer, there are three names associated with this special ordinance of Jesus; Holy Communion, The Lord's Supper and The Eucharist. Originating from a Greek word found in the New Testament, eucharistia, this special word has always been associated with Jesus' meal of thankful remembrance and is an opportunity to be spiritually blessed as we are intentionally thankful.

Good Friday is an incredibly solemn day. As the hymn writer Charles Wesley put it in his hymn 'And can it be'; '*'Tis mystery all! The immortal dies:*' That Jesus suffered unimaginable anguish and died for our sins is an absolute reason to be thankful. And yet, his death alone does not give us reason to be thankful. Knowing that he is risen gives us a certain hope. Easter shows us how Jesus is the fulfiller of promises. He died, he lives, he paid the price for sin, he assures his followers of the resurrection to come and we are never alone.

We might find it hard to be thankful at times. But this is a season to be especially mindful of reasons for thankfulness. Let us grasp the opportunity and celebrate the one who loves us, who died for us and lives that we might be with him.

Curate's Corner....

Hi Everyone,

We've all heard the story of an apprentice builder, joiner, or electrician on their first day who has been sent to the warehouse to look for a long wait, only to realise it's a joke, a test of character by fellow peers and employees. A cruel joke and yet it brings to mind the discipline of waiting. How good are you at waiting? Would you say you're patient? In traffic? In the queue at the till? What about waiting on God to answer a prayer?



I've recently been reading a book on the future of the Christian Church post-Covid. Overall the book says the solution isn't more programs and events, but to wait on God. We live in a world where busyness is glorified, society says the busier we are the better, but that's so far from the truth. Root and Bertrand say "Busyness dominates us, acceleration causes fatigue, filling our lives till there is no room left, even if the thing we want to add could be valuable".

It might be surprising to know that in Acts 1:4 the first command Jesus gives to the disciples is "Do not to leave Jerusalem". We might have expected him to command them to go out, to witness, start a program, to preach and do anything that would make the church bigger. But he instructed them to wait. We like to think that the Church began with revival and growth that we read of in Acts 2, but actually it began in Acts 1 with waiting on God. Waiting meets none of our criteria for success, perhaps our greatest fear is that we will wait but God will not show up. But this is faith; what God promised God will do. This is hope; that the God who began good work will see it to completion. Waiting as practised by the disciples is not inactive, it's not lazy, but it is responsive. God acts and we respond.

So if we're currently in a season of life that involves waiting let us hold firm that is not unproductive, but rather it is true discipleship to wait on the Lord's direction and plans and when that' is revealed we act in responsive obedience.

"But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint"

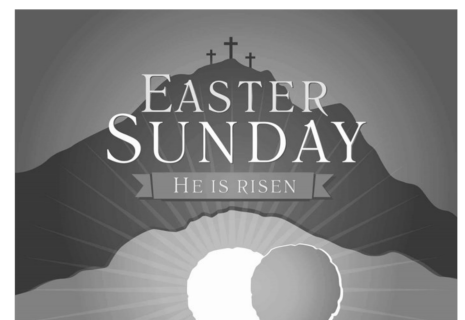
Holy Week

The evening service on Maundy Thursday (28th) will take place at 7pm and include a meal and Holy Communion. This annual service will feature the Archbishop of Armagh and sign up sheets for catering purposes will be available in the Church porch.

The Good Friday, '3 Hours Service' will take place from 12noon to 3pm. Conducting this Service will be Bishop Harold Miller who is the former Bishop of Down and Dromore Dioceses. This is always a very moving service as we focus upon the final hours of the Lord's life on the cross. Please feel free attend at any stage, and for as long as you are able.

Easter Sunday Services begin at The Argory with the Diocesan Dawn Service at 6.30am. This is always a very joyful service and will feature the St Mark's Portadown Worship Band, and the Archbishop of Armagh. 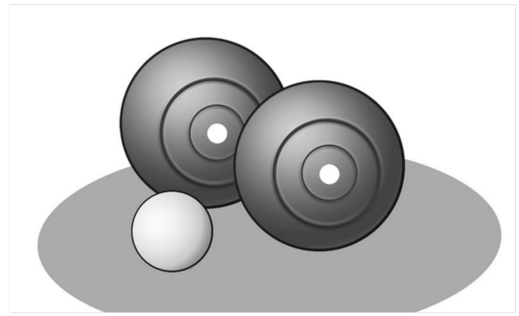
THE BOWLING CLUB
